The ACM Student Chapter at Dakota State University participates in and contributes to the local community through various actions that include community laser tag, Days of Service, Feed the Need, help nights for students, and assist DSU alumni in relocating back to Madison. Both members and officers of the organization participate in these events. For these reasons, the DSU ACM Student Chapter believes that it provides effective student and community leadership.

Currently, the DSU ACM Student Chapter hosts community laser-tag. The DSU ACM Student Chapter owns a full array of professional laser-tag equipment including guns and vests. This is usually set up by the local church, or by independent parties who desire to play on-campus with the equipment. Considering that the alternative options for playing laser-tag are located at least fifty miles away, Dakota State University ACM Student Chapter provides an easy way to play without travelling too far.

The DSU ACM Student Chapter also assists with the Days of Service event. Days of Service is an event where students and faculty at Dakota State University give back to the community of Madison by assisting with various projects. Members and officers of the club provided instruction and organization to groups of high-school students in learning about computer-related subjects. They also contributed to several community-service projects such as cleaning ditches, cemeteries, and local parks.

In addition, the DSU ACM Student Chapter also provides two help nights per week to DSU students. Twice a week for two hour spans, the DSU ACM Student Chapter members assist students in completing projects, assignments, and learning about new technology.
