Charter of the ACM Education Board

Constituted: November 2005 Revised and Approved: August 2, 2024 (Education Board Meeting, Boston, MA)

Scope

The general scope of the Education Board is to promote computing education at secondary and postsecondary levels. The Board will serve as an executive committee overseeing the Education Advisory Committee and will initiate, direct, and manage key ACM educational projects. This includes activities, such as the development of curriculum recommendations, the coordination of educational activities, and efforts to provide educational and informational services to the broader ACM community. This body will include representatives of all appropriate ACM Committees, Councils, SIGs, and geographic regions that are concerned with accreditation, curricula, and other educational activities.

Executive Committee

The voting membership of the Education Board is as follows:

- Chair or Co-Chairs
- Vice-Chair
- Past Chair
- At least five, and not more than ten, at large members

Liaisons with other boards, councils, and committees within ACM will be invited to attend meetings as appropriate in a non-voting, ex-officio capacity.

Appointments

The Chair/Co-Chairs are appointed by the ACM President. The remaining members, including the Vice-Chair and the At-large members, are appointed as specified in <u>ACM Bylaw 7</u> *Committees, Boards, and Councils,* that is, appointed by the Education Board Chair/Co-Chairs with the advice and consent of the ACM President. The two-year term of office for all Education Board members and officers is also specified in <u>ACM Bylaw 7</u>. The Chair/Co-Chairs may also appoint non-voting members as advisors.
